Sir/Madam,

With reference to above referred letter, this is to inform you that deletion of non existent beneficiaries under dysfunctional toilet has been stopped by Ministry. All the deleted entry will be reversed into a suspense account on IMIS which can be edited by the district. (Point no: - 4 of the referred letter)

The deletion of non existent beneficiaries will be done by state only after the district provides a Non-Existing Certificate (NEC) letter to state and MDWS. The format for NEC letter is provided in point no: - 5 of the referred letter.

It is therefore requested to kindly instruct the team to start collecting the NEC letters as soon as possible, else these entries will keep on showing in the dysfunctional list and this will cause a problem at the time of ODF declaration of the particular block or district.

**Subject:** State Action on Dysfunctional Toilets.

Dear Sir/Madam,

As you are aware, the SBM (G) guidelines defines dysfunctional toilets as toilets which are non-usable and/or unsafe toilets, constructed during the Central Rural Sanitation Programme (CRSP), Total Sanitation Campaign (TSC) or Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan (NBA). While a majority of households with dysfunctional toilets have given incentive under the previous programmes, there might be some non-eligible Households (HHs) which would have dysfunctional toilets.

2. As per IMIS, currently, there are 30.1 Lakh remaining dysfunctional toilets in the country. Since, most of these Households were provided government assistance in the past, it is suggested to fund them through non-SBM (G) funds, towards conversion. The list of funding sources is given in Annexure I.

3. It is for your information that the option for converting dysfunctional toilets to the functional category has been provided in the MIS in form C-08, in which a dysfunctional toilet can be converted to repaired/retrofitted. Some strategies adopted by different States in this regard are given in Annexure II, for reference.

3. It is further understood that some households, mentioned as having dysfunctional toilets on the MIS, have not been found on the ground. These entries will be shifted to a new module (suspense account) under IMIS that shall be informed to you in due course of time.

4. Additionally, in the past few months, States/districts have deleted approximately 6.5 lakh dysfunctional toilets from the MIS. The deletion feature has been disabled in the IMIS as of June 2018. These deleted entries (6.5 Lakh) will also be reversed by the NIC into the new module (suspense account) which may also be edited by you.

5. The State will take corrective action on the entries in the suspense account. The State can re-delete these entries once they provide a Non-Existing Certificate (NEC) to MDWS. The NEC should certify the following -

"The listed beneficiaries, marked for deletion, have not been provided financial incentive under any Sanitation Programme of this Ministry viz. Central Rural Sanitation Programme (CRSP) /Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan (NBA) /Total Sanitation and the households physically do not exist".

6.The States are also suggested to follow the format in Annexure III and report the breakup of the remaining dysfunctional toilets in their State.
