## Minutes of meeting with the District Coordinators, LSBA chaired by the OSD, MoDWS, Government of India on 15.11.2016

- 1. The meeting to review the status of Ganga Action Plan (GAP) under SBM (G) was chaired by OSD, MoDWS, GOI. It was attended by the Secretary, RDD, Government of Bihar, CEO JEEViKA cum Mission Director LSBA, LSBA team from headquarter Patna, District Coordinators, LSBA, the Development partners, and other officers of the 12 Ganga Action Plan districts.
- The current status of implementation of GAP was discussed individually with the district coordinators to understand the hurdles in execution and to explore the solutions for smooth implementation of the program. 29 out of 473 villages have been declared Open defecation free, and 53887 IHHLs have been constructed as against the target of 424205.
- 3. OSD, MDWS emphasized that the 473 villages adjoining the river Ganges in 12 districts of the state has to be made ODF by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2016. The same has also been informed to the districts during the video conference held on 20.10.2016. He stressed upon the need to follow a war path for implementation of the program with set deadlines against each village. The district coordinators were positive that the target of making the 473 villages ODF will be achieved within timeframe.
- 4. The district coordinators put forward the following issues related to the program:
  - All the District coordinators were unanimous in requesting for more technical support from the development partners. The need for accelerated IEC, BCC, and CLTS campaign was recognised by the Secretary, RDD, too and OSD, MoDWS was requested to provide additional support with regard to Development Partners.
  - Further, issues that arose out of discussion have been tabulated below:

SI No	District	Issues
1	Buxar	Two villages, namely North Nainijor and South Nainijor has been cut off due to water logging. All other villages will be made ODF within the timeframe.
2	Katihar	Six villages have issues with access. Target for completion in these villages is challenging.
3	Munger	Six villages have water logging issues and unable to dig toilet pits due to water seepage.  Access to IMIS at the block level needs to be granted for speedy updation of progress.  ITC has been working on sanitation in the district. There is scope for collaboration between DWSC and ITC to work in tandem for achieving ODF status.
4	Patna	Five villages have been transferred to Nagar Panchayat and hence no longer fall in to the ambit of SBM (g).

5. The District Coordinators laid out a detailed implementation plan with milestones to be achieved by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016. The details of the same are tabulated below:

- 6. The role of Development Partners in Ganga Action Plan districts was discussed in detail. CEO, Jeevika urged development partners to deploy their expertise in GAP districts on priority basis, and focus on these 473 villages until the targets are achieved.
- 7. It was decided that the development partners will earmark the villages where they will provide support. Mr. Debaraj Behera of World Bank will finalise the list, along with clearly mentioned timelines, roles, and responsibilities of development partners and email the same in two days.
- 8. It was discussed that there needs to be an effective IEC strategy to mobilize support and create a sanitation movement in the GAP districts. Mr Pravin More of UNICEF has kindly taken up the task of preparing the strategy document for the same and sharing it with the state LSBA team in two days.
- 9. The district coordinators were instructed to organise awareness campaign on the occasion of World Toilet Day on 19.11.2016. They were instructed to coordinate with various departments of the district administration to organise events across villages near Ganga such as rally, Prabhat Pheri, human chains and spread the message of sanitation.

- 11. It was agreed in the meeting that the CEO and the Secretary, RDD will take appropriate action to facilitate speedy implementation of and declaration of ODF, especially in villages where there are issues with access.
- 12. OSD, MoDWS conducted a Video Conferencing meeting with the Deputy Development Commissioners and Director DRDA of Ganga Action Plan district, and reiterated the need to expedite implementation of the program.
